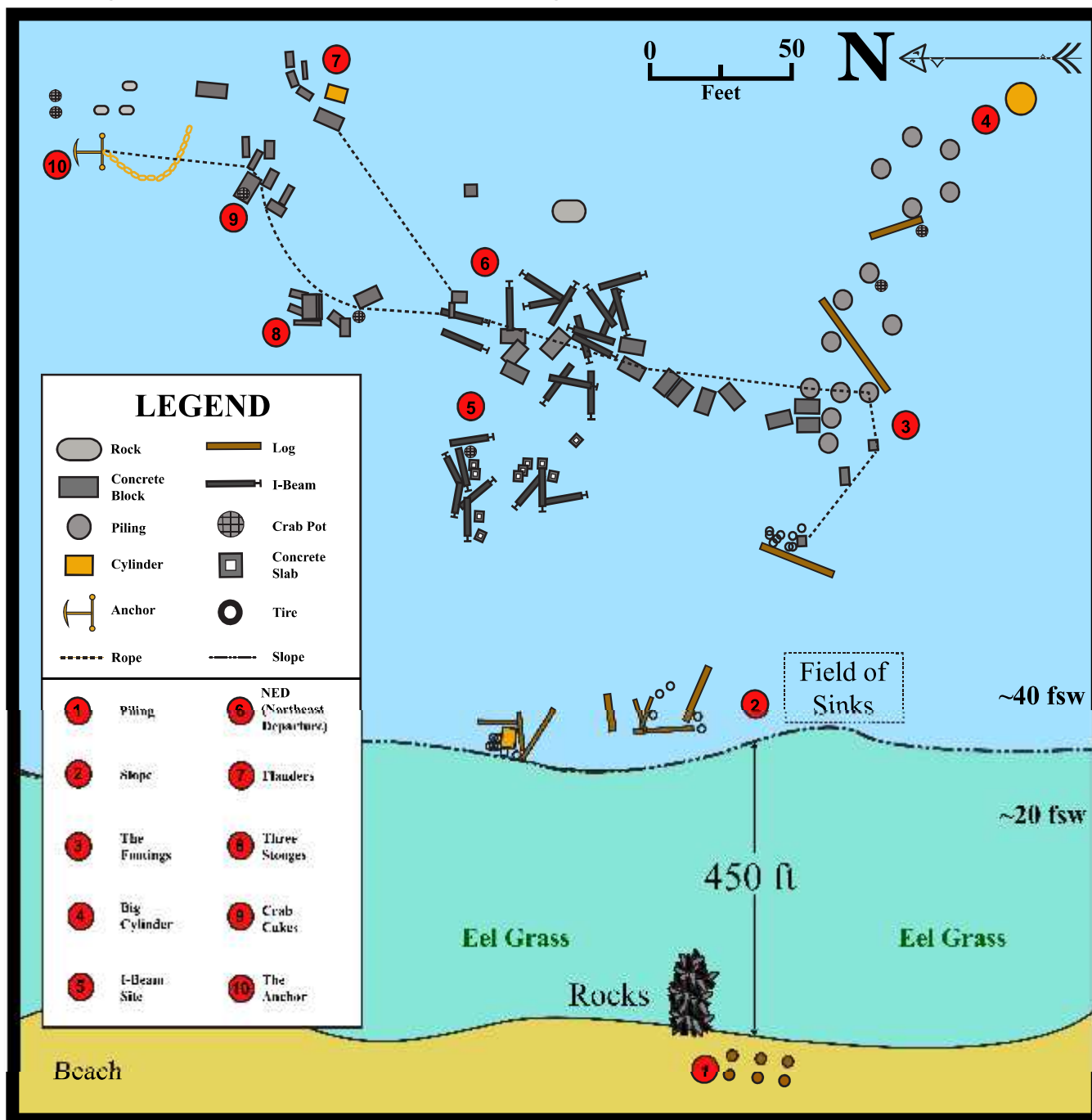


FORT FLAGLER DIVE SITE

Fort Flagler Historical State Park, 10541 Flagler Rd, Nordland, WA 98358

N48°05.4724' W122°41.5402'



Site Description: A trail from the parking lot leads down to the beach where divers can see old wooden pilings. The site itself is made up of remnants of the old pier that had been demolished. Divers may explore a majority of the site by following a rope that is laid down in a north-south direction.

The main part of the site would be **5**, the I-Beam Site where divers may find a higher concentration of marine life compared to the rest of the dive site. Rockfish, lingcod, sole, skate, wolf eel and the occasional seal are just some of the marine life divers may encounter here. Depth ranges between 30 to 50 feet for this dive site.

Current Table: Look up daily current predictions for 0.3 Mile Northeast of Marrowstone Point, Admiralty Inlet. Apply the following time corrections to calculate slack current times:

Minimum current before flood : - 60 minutes
Minimum current before ebb : +75 minutes

This site is highly current-dependent, recommended for intermediate divers. Best to dive on slack before flood.

Enter dive site at **1** and surface swim for 450 feet in an easterly direction towards **2** by lining up the pilings located on shore. Head east until the north-south rope is found.

Note: Shallow area not to scale

WARNING

Strong currents are common at this site. Dive only during periods of minimal current. Always make a visual check of water movement before entering the water.
